Your affiant, Erika McFarland- Williams, has been a Law Enforcement Officer in the State of Florida for eighteen (18) years. She is currently employed as a Law Enforcement Senior Inspector with the Florida Department of Corrections (the Department), Officer of the Inspector General (OIG), Special Investigations Unit, in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Your Affiant began in law enforcement in 2002, with Lauderhill Police Department. There she conducted numerous complex criminal investigations related to sexual battery, robbery, aggravated battery/assaults, and homicide. In 2012, your affiant resigned from Lauderhill Police Department and was hired as a Senior Law Enforcement Inspector with the Florida OIG.

In this capacity, your affiant has investigated the facts and circumstances of the Florida Department of Corrections Office of the Inspector General Case Number 19-02821.

On or about February 15, 2019 the Department of Corrections, Office of the Inspector General received a call at the Fort Lauderdale Field Office from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] alleged that on February 12, 2019 he witnessed multiple incidents of excessive force in or around Charlie dormitory at Martin Correctional Institution. Upon initial review of the information, the Office of the Inspector General initiated a Complaint Review Report #19-02821, assigned to Senior Inspectors Erika McFarland-Williams and Rodney Vega on February 15, 2019.

After initial review by the Office of Inspector General, the disclosure by the complainant did include an alleged act or suspected act of gross mismanagement, malfeasance, misfeasance, gross waste of public funds, suspected or actual Medicaid fraud or abuse, or gross neglect of duty committed by an employee or agent of an agency or independent contractor and was determined to fall under the purview of Whistle-Blower designation.

February 19, 2019

Senior Inspectors McFarland-Williams and Vega conducted a recorded sworn interview with [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. In his sworn recorded testimony [REDACTED] reported three unnecessary uses of force he had personally observed at Martin Correctional Institution by Correctional Officers at the institution. All three incidents were observed on February 12, 2019.

In the first unnecessary use of force reported to SI's McFarland-Williams and Vega, [REDACTED] stated he observed a male later identified as [REDACTED], being removed from C-Dormitory after it was determined I/M [REDACTED] was apparently high on an unknown substance. [REDACTED] observed I/M [REDACTED] being removed without incident and did not witness I/M [REDACTED] being combative or belligerent in any way. When [REDACTED] walked outside of C-Dormitory he observed I/M [REDACTED] being forcibly thrown down to the ground while he was cuffed. [REDACTED] admitted he did not see what led to I/M [REDACTED] being forcibly thrown down to the ground, but he felt as though the amount of force used to throw I/M [REDACTED] down was unjustified.

The second use of unnecessary force reported by [REDACTED] was against Inmate [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he saw the incident take place in the grassy area between dormitories C and D. I/M [REDACTED] was being belligerent and cursing at Corrections Personnel. [REDACTED] then stated he saw Sgt. Junior Garlobo (ID #71216) tell I/M [REDACTED] that, if [REDACTED] keeps talking, we were going to spray him. I/M [REDACTED] refused to stop talking, and Sgt. Garlobo proceeded to spray I/M [REDACTED] in the face with OC spray. I/M [REDACTED] was then taken to the ground, cuffed and handled roughly by several Correctional Officers after being sprayed and subdued by Sgt. Garlobo. I/M [REDACTED] was then removed to solitary confinement.

In the third unnecessary use of force reported by [REDACTED] he stated that a male inmate later identified as [REDACTED] wanted to check himself in because he was in fear of his safety. After speaking to I/M [REDACTED] [REDACTED] states that Sgt. Jonathan Abreu (ID #84532) came to C-Dormitory and took custody of I/M [REDACTED]. While outside of C-Dormitory, [REDACTED] observed Sgt. Abreu ordering I/M [REDACTED] to eat a small plastic packet containing what was believed to be salt. According to [REDACTED] I/M [REDACTED] was reluctant to eat the packet, but he was repeatedly ordered to do so by Sgt. Abreu. I/M [REDACTED] attempted to eat the inside contents of the packet but was unable to swallow the plastic packet. After I/M [REDACTED] spit the plastic packet out, Sgt. Abreu sprayed I/M [REDACTED] in the face with OC spray. Sgt. Abreu ordered I/M [REDACTED] to raise his hands up, and he complied. With his hands raised in the air, I/M [REDACTED] was again blasted in the face with OC spray by Sgt. Abreu. I/M [REDACTED] was then restrained and removed to solitary confinement without any further incident observed by [REDACTED].

After observing multiple incidents of unnecessary use of force in one day, [REDACTED] stated he did not feel comfortable working at Martin CI. [REDACTED] told SI's McFarland-Williams and Vega that he has worked at other Correctional Institutions in the past and has seen numerous occasions when use of force was necessarily and properly applied by Corrections personnel. In these instances, [REDACTED] stated he saw no violations of Florida statutes or codes perpetrated by the inmates involved in the incidents he described. [REDACTED] further went on to state that observing these unnecessary uses of force made him feel as though Martin CI was an unsafe place to work. [REDACTED] went to Martin CI [REDACTED]

On the day [REDACTED] had his telephone recording in real time when he went [REDACTED] to Majors Kimberly Foster (ID #31822) and Nathan Pollock (ID #25907), both assigned to Martin Correctional Institution. During the recording, which [REDACTED] played for SI's McFarland-Williams and Vega, [REDACTED] is heard explaining to Majors Foster and Pollock his reasons for [REDACTED] including the fact that he felt afraid for his safety after witnessing multiple instances of unnecessary use of force. [REDACTED] is heard on the recording talking specifically about the three incidents of unnecessary force that he witnessed three days earlier. [REDACTED] stated he made the recording because he wanted to make sure he protected himself from Majors Pollock and Foster making up a story as to [REDACTED] informed SI's McFarland-Williams and Vega that he would cooperate in any investigations conducted by the FDC Office of Inspector General.

On the day of [REDACTED] Major Foster generated an incident report, which led to the creation of MINS report #910279. In the incident and MINS report Major Foster stated that after conducting [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] on the day [REDACTED] informed her that "inmates told him that staff at Martin Correctional Institution mistreat inmates. [REDACTED] stated that he did not witness this personally, nor did he identify the inmates or staff members involved". Based on the testimony of [REDACTED] and after reviewing the preliminary evidence, including the recorded conversation between [REDACTED] and Majors Foster and Pollock, it has been determined that Major Foster created a false incident report.

August 14, 2019

Senior Inspectors Erika McFarland-Williams and Rodney Vega met with Major Kimberly Foster at Martin Correctional Institution (MCI). Major Foster completed FDOC IG Oath and Perjury Warning form (DC1-850) which indicated this was an official investigation concerning allegations of Physical abuse by members of Martin CI, any false statements about material matters given by a witness or subject under oath, will constitute the crime of perjury. Major Foster signed this form indicating she understood and agreed to provide a Post Miranda statement. The details of the interview are as follows:

After being shown a copy of an incident report and MINS report dated 02/15/2019, Major Foster was asked if she recognized the reports. Major Foster answered she did recognize them. When asked if she prepared the reports, Major Foster answered she prepared the incident report, but that the MINS report was prepared by Classification Officer Patricia McGee-Aviano, at Major Foster's request and based upon the wording of the incident report prepared by Major Foster. Major Foster was then asked if she remembered the details surrounding the preparation of the incident report, and she stated she did. Major Foster recalled [REDACTED] with the Florida Department of Corrections. [REDACTED] Major Foster and Major Nathan Pollock were present during the conversation. According to Major Foster, [REDACTED] was [REDACTED] FDC because he had heard from the prisoners that prisoners were being abused at MCI. When asked if [REDACTED] gave any specific instances, Major Foster stated that [REDACTED] did not give any specific instances of inmate abuse. Major Foster claimed she even asked [REDACTED] if he had witnessed any instances of inmate abuse, and she claimed that [REDACTED] did not give her any specific instances because he did not witness any. Major Foster also claimed she asked [REDACTED] whether he could remember any of the names of the security personnel that were supposedly involved in the inmate abuse, but [REDACTED] could not supply any names because he was new to MCI. Major Foster was given an opportunity to admit that [REDACTED] did give her specific instances of inmate abuse that he personally witnessed, but she did not.

August 19, 2019

Senior Inspector Rodney Vega interviewed Classification Officer Patricia McGee-Aviano at Martin Correctional Institution (MCI). Classification Officer McGee-Aviano provided a sworn recorded statement which indicated the following:

During the interview CO McGee-Aviano was asked if she recognized the MINS report created by her on

02/15/2019. CO McGee-Aviano stated she did recognize it. CO McGee stated she created the MINS report based on the incident report created by Major Kimberly Foster on the same date. When asked if she had a conversation with Major Foster regarding the preparation of the MINS report, CO McGee-Aviano stated she did not. She based the MINS report strictly on the incident report prepared by Major Foster. When asked why the preparation of the MINS report was necessary in this case, CO McGee-Aviano stated a MINS report was necessary because there were allegations of misconduct by correctional officers in the incident report created by Major Foster.

August 20, 2019

Senior Inspectors Erika McFarland-Williams and Rodney Vega interviewed Colonel Nathan Pollock at the Ft. Lauderdale SIU Field Office. Colonel Pollock provided a sworn recorded statement which indicated the following:

When shown a copy of the MINS report created on 02/15/2019 by Classification Officer Patricia McGee-Aviano and the incident report created on 02/15/2019 by Major Kimberly Foster, and asked if he recognized those reports, Colonel Pollock stated he had not seen these reports previously. When asked if he could recall any specific incidents mentioned in the reports, and whether those reports refreshed his recollections as to the events that took place on that specific day, Colonel Pollock stated he vaguely remembered the events that led to the creation of those reports. Colonel Pollock stated he remembered speaking to [REDACTED] on that day. He stated that [REDACTED] was [REDACTED] the Florida Dept of Corrections because [REDACTED] did not feel safe working at Martin Correctional Institution (MCI). When asked if [REDACTED] stated why he did not feel safe working at MCI, Colonel Pollock could not recall if [REDACTED] gave any specific examples, but he stated that [REDACTED] said the inmates were being mistreated by staff, and that he did not want to be part of that. Colonel Pollock was asked who was present when [REDACTED] was [REDACTED] Colonel Pollock stated it was himself, [REDACTED] and Major Kimberly Foster. Colonel Pollock was asked again whether he could recall if [REDACTED] gave any specific instances of staff mistreating or abusing inmates, and Colonel Pollock could not remember if [REDACTED] gave any specific examples. When asked what was done after [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Colonel Pollock stated he and Major Foster reported to Warden Brynner and informed him of [REDACTED]. Colonel Pollock then stated he recalled Warden Brynner instructing Major Foster to create an incident report regarding [REDACTED] but he could not remember any other specific details regarding the conversation between himself, Major Foster and Warden Brynner. Colonel Pollock then stated that was the end of his involvement with this incident.

September 30, 2019

[REDACTED] voluntarily signed a Waiver to Release Whistle-Blower Identity.

Based upon this investigation, your Affiant has probable cause to believe and does believe that on February 12, 2019, at Martin Correctional Institution 1150 SW Allapattah Rd, Indiantown, Martin County, Florida, Correctional Officer Major Kimberly Foster (DOB, [REDACTED]), herein referred to as the "defendant", did knowingly and unlawfully commit the crime of False Official Statement, in violation of 837.06., the defendant did knowingly make a false statement in writing with the intent to mislead a public servant in the performance of the public servant's official duty, in violation of 837.06 Fla. Stat. to wit: witness testimony, incident reports, and physical evidence established probable cause to believe that on February 15, 2019, the defendant and Major Nathan Pollock, met with [REDACTED] as he requested [REDACTED] at Martin Correctional Institution. During the meeting [REDACTED] explained to Majors Foster and Pollock his reasons for [REDACTED] including the fact that he felt afraid for his safety after witnessing multiple instances of unnecessary use of forces. [REDACTED] specifically talked about three incidents of unnecessary force that he witnessed three days earlier. On the day of [REDACTED] the defendant generated an incident report, which led to the creation of MINS report #910279. In the incident and MINS report the defendant stated after [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] on [REDACTED] [REDACTED] informed her that "inmates told him that staff at Martin Correctional Institution mistreat inmates. [REDACTED] stated that he did not witness this personally, nor did he identify the inmates or staff members involved." Based on the testimony of [REDACTED] and after reviewing the preliminary evidence, it has been determined that the defendant created a false incident report.

Count II

Your Affiant has probable cause to believe and does believe that the defendant, did knowingly and unlawfully commit the crime of Perjury when not in an official proceeding, in violation of 837.012 (1) Fla. Stat., Whoever makes a false statement, which he or she does not believe to be true, under oath, not in an official proceeding, in regard to any material matter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.

775.082 or 775.083. to wit: Major Foster completed an Oath and Perjury form and Miranda Warning form indicating she was aware the Inspector General's Office was conducting an official investigation concerning allegations of Physical abuse by members of Martin CI. Major Foster was asked a series of questions pertaining to [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] Major Foster denied [REDACTED] gave any specific instances concerning allegations of inmate abuse. On the day [REDACTED] had his telephone recording in real time when he went in [REDACTED] to Majors Foster and Pollock. During the recording, [REDACTED] is heard explaining to Majors Foster and Pollock his reasons for why he decided to [REDACTED] including the fact that he felt afraid for his safety after witnessing multiple instances of unnecessary use of forces. [REDACTED] is heard on the recording talking specifically about the incidents he witnessed three days earlier. [REDACTED] stated he observed three inmates being gassed in or around Charlie dormitory. The first inmate was over in Quad 3, they took him outside, but he did not see what happened after that. The second Inmate was gassed outside, and he was not doing anything. Sgt. Abreu tells the inmate if you keep talking, he was going to drop him. 'seconds later, this man on the floor for no reason." The third inmate got sprayed for trying to check in. He was there when it happened but is not listed on the paperwork because he was not doing it. [REDACTED] reported he did not see the inmates doing anything but rather it's the staff. [REDACTED] stated, "but being two days here seeing already the stuff the officers doing to the inmates for no reason, I got too much integrity for that." [REDACTED] stated he made the recording because he wanted to make sure he protected himself from Majors Pollock and Foster making up a story as to [REDACTED] After reviewing the telephone recording, it has been determined that the Major Foster committed the crime of perjury by knowingly making a false statement while under oath during her sworn recorded statement.

Your Affiant respectfully submits that probable cause has been established that Kimberly Foster, on the grounds of Martin Correctional Institution in Indiantown, Martin County, Florida

Count I

did knowingly and unlawfully commit the crime of Perjury when not in an official proceeding, in violation of 837.012 (1) Fla. Stat.,

Count II

did knowingly make a false statement in writing with the intent to mislead a public servant in the performance of the public servant's official duty, in violation of 837.06 Fla. Stat.

Your Affiant further respectfully requests that an arrest warrant be issued for Kimberly Foster, W/F, DOB [REDACTED] for one count of 837.012 (1) Fla. Stat and one count of 837.06 Fla. Stat.
