84. NARRATIVE OF THE FACTUAL BASIS FOR PROBABLE CAUSE: The undersigned; certifies and swears that he/she has just and reasonable grounds to believe that the heretofore named defendant did commit the violations of law as stated above and the factual basis for this belief is as follows:

Your Affiant is Ryan Nicholas, a Law Enforcement Inspector with Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Corrections. In this capacity, your affiant has investigated the circumstances of Inspector General case number 19-20135 and has found probable cause exists that South Bay Correctional Facility Correctional Officer Hentazha Parker has violated Florida Statue 944.47 (1) (a), Introduction of Contraband into a State Institution.

On or about November 14, 2019, the Office of the Inspector General was notified that on November 14, 2019, Correctional Officer Hentazha Parker (Officer Parker) introduced alcohol contained in four (4) water bottles into the secure area of South Bay Correctional Facility (SBCF) located at 600 US highway 27, South Bay, Florida 33493.

Your Affiant took sworn statements from Geo Group representatives, Inspector Marc Simmons, Inspector Christopher Castner, Warden William Hamilton, and Officer Nikisha James, in which they all stated on November 14, 2019, Officer Parker brought four (4) water bottles into the secure area of SBCF. Inspector Simmons, Inspector Castner, and Warden Hamilton stated the contents in the (4) water bottles contained alcohol.

Inspector Simmons reported in a sworn statement that on November 13, 2019, he received an anonymous inmate request reporting wrongdoing by Officer Parker. The anonymous request reported Officer Parker introduces contraband into SBCF and was involved in a staff/offender relationship with Inmate Rashad Smith. Warden Hamilton was made aware of the allegation and a planned search of Officer Parker's persons and belongings entering SBCF on November 14, 2019, was coordinated. On November 14, 2019, in the capacity as a correctional officer, Hentazha Parker entered the main entrance lobby. A subsequent search of her property yielded that four (4) water bottles contained alcohol. This incident was witnessed by Inspector Castner and Warden Hamilton.

Your Affiant recovered and reviewed the surveillance recording of the incident from GEO Inspector Simmons. The four (4) water bottles were collected by Evidence Inspector Kevin Patterson from GEO Inspector Simmons. The recording was dated November 14, 2019. The video depicted Officer Parker entering the main entrance lobby with her property, which included four (4) water bottles.

Officer Parker reported in a Mirandized statement that on November 14, 2019, she reported to SBCF to assume her duties as a correctional officer. She entered the lobby and submitted her property for processing. She put her food and four (4) water bottles in the designated bin. She realized she accidently left her cell phone charger in her belongings. She noticed two inspectors and Warden Hamilton were located in the lobby and Inspector Simmons told her she could take the charger back to her vehicle. She stated she intended on putting her property back into her bag, but the inspector said, "we got it." She left the lobby and placed the charger back into her vehicle. When asked what was inside the water bottles, Officer Parker brought in on November 14, 2019, Officer Parker said, "I want my lawyer to be here for that." There was no further questioning.

While at the District 10 Regional Evidence Control Area on December 4, 2019, your Affiant and Inspector Patterson took samples from each of the four (4) water bottles seized. The samples were put into four (4) separate glass vials and shipped to The Department of Financial Services, Division of Investigative and Forensic Services-Bureau of Forensic Services for substance identification. Inspector Patterson notated the liquid substance in the contraband bottles were filled to the very top of the cap and the plastic security seal had been broken. When compared to other (non-contraband) unopened water bottles, the contraband items were different. The contraband bottles were filled to the brim, whereas, the compared bottles of water had an unfilled space between the cap and the neck of the bottle. On January 6, 2020, Department of Financial Services, Division of Investigative and Forensic Services-Bureau of Forensic Services provided laboratory report #191523. The result indicated all four (4) exhibits contained ethanol.

Based upon the above facts gathered during this investigation, your affiant believes that probable cause has been established that Correctional Officer Hentazha Parker violated Florida Statue 944.47 (1) (a), Introduction of Contraband into a State Correctional Institution.
